Eligibility guidelines: Age 14-21; must be eligible for free or reduced lunch and have an additional barrier to employment

Program description: Summer employment program for youth who live anywhere in the South Shore Workforce Investment Board Area
Eligibility guidelines: Low-income, at risk youth currently in school or dropped out

Program description: Employment and career awareness program that connects high school youth to the world of work. Uses the Massachusetts Work-Based Learning Plan to provide structured learning experience.
Eligibility guidelines: Youth interested in working, with focus on helping high school students with MCAS scores in the "Failing/Needs Improvement" category
Program locations: High schools in the following districts: Braintree, Plymouth, Quincy and Randolph
